

Recap: more than 600 days of war

In late February 2022, a 60 kmlong column of Russian tanks was snaking its way towards Kyiv. Instead of giving in to fear, we decided to act: we created Ukrainian Patriot and were joined by many people from all over the world. To read more about our volunteers, click <u>here</u>. It has now been more than 600 days of Russia's full-scale invasion; more than 600 days of Russian missiles and bombs destroying civilian and industrial buildings, agricultural and energy infrastructure - as well as the Kakhovka Dam.



THE RUSSIANS DESTROYED MORE THAN 120,000 CIVILIAN INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES, INCLUDING POWER PLANTS, GAS PIPELINES, SCHOOLS, KINDERGARTENS, AS WELL AS 1.5 MILLION HOMES.

Five days following the start of Russia's full-scale invasion, we swung into action, responding to requests from individuals and organizations seeking help. We vet these requests and deliver essential items to those in need on the ground in Ukraine.


We collaborate with trusted local contacts all over the country. Our connections play a crucial role and ensure that the assistance is targeted and effective, which is critical under war conditions.

We are that last mile that allows aid from all over the world to get to where it needs to most.

We have served more than 11 oblasts (regions) and 50 towns, cities, and locations around Ukraine - almost all of which are just kilometers from the frontline. Our volunteers must navigate roads and infrastructure damaged from direct fire, while subject to sounds of regular and frequent explosions to the point that it becomes "normal" background noise.

Delivery Locations





Humanitarian Aid



We distribute essential supplies. This includes: food bags to sustain a family of four for a week, clean water provisions, hygiene and warm clothing kits, power generators, portable chargers, flashlights, heaters, candles, and pet food for shelters and individuals.

Medical Supplies and Equipment



We provide a range of medical support. This includes first aid and trauma supplies, tactical medicine training/combat casualty care for Ukrainian defenders, as well as medicines and cleaning supplies for hospitals and treatment centers along the frontlines.

Our medical aid is provided to both civilians and defenders and we have two operational ambulances in frontline areas.

PILLAR 4

PTSD and Psychological Trauma Assistance

We provide assistance to address the severe emotional and psychological toll that conflict, displacement, and other traumatic events can have on the mental well-being of civilians in Ukraine.

THERAPEUTIC DANCE SESSIONS

We have offered 17 therapeutic dance sessions to eastern and southern Ukrainian communities, many of which suffered under occupation for months. These sessions allow the children of these communities an opportunity to forget about - if only for a short time - the realities of war and provide a way of coping with trauma that may be affecting their day-to-day activities.



Rebuilding Assistance



Here in Ukraine, many have suffered a profound loss that is measured both in lives and in homes. Waiting for the war to be over is not an option when people are in desperate need of support. Our Rebuilding program offers a helping hand to those who have been hit with devastation and loss.

We focus on both *human* & *animal* welfare, providing invaluable physical and financial support to help individuals rebuild their lives and to restore the sanctuaries of our beloved animal companions.

In the Donetsk area, we built a new addition to an **animal shelter** that will serve as a warm home to about 20 dogs.
